





Charles Darwin – the boy




Charles Darwin was born in 1809 in Shrewsbury, England.





Charles Darwin – the young man






He went to University to become a doctor

In 1827, at the age of 18, Darwin realised he did not like the study of medicine and could not bear the sight of blood. He left and went to become a vicar.


He never became a vicar, but instead sailed around the world.

The Beagle set sail on her voyage in 1831, with Charles Darwin aboard. The voyage lasted 5 years.


He discovered finches

For example dogs






Whippets are very fast runners, but terriers are good guard dogs because they are fierce.












On the Origin of Species
